Rooney's Golf Foundation has donated \$921,420 to Palm Beach County charities since 2001. These funds are raised through the two annual golf tournaments (since 2002), a 5K Run/Walk (2007), a poker tournament (2010), the Overcomer luncheon (2014) and Bowling Bash (2018). The 4th Annual RGF Spring Golf Tournament is set for Thurs., May 2, 2019 at Abacoa Golf Club. Westgate/Belvedere Homes Community Interesting Facts:

1. The Westgate /Belvedere Homes community was initially developed to serve the service men and women of Morrison Field Air Base, an air transport and training base during World War II. The first structures outside of the Air Base were the residences of the Belvedere Homes Subdivision, north of Belvedere road. These homes were built in the 1950's with only two modest floor plans: a two bedroom/one bathroom and a three bedroom/one bathroom. However, all of these buildings have a fireplace which is an important architectural feature which symbolically represents the "heart" of the homes.
2. Public right-of-ways within the Westgate/Belvedere Homes were platted in the 1920's and developed in a grid pattern reminiscent of great traditional towns instead of the more contemporary cul-de-sacs of the Florida gated communities. This is not your "new urbanism" but the highly sought after "old urbanism" than many new developments try to emulate. Interestingly enough, these right-of-ways also have Native American names rather than regional tropical fruits or flora.
3. The Westgate/Belvedere Homes community is centrally located and is within a five-mile radius of the County's major arts/culture/entertainment and shopping destinations, including but not limited to, Cruzan Amphitheatre, Kravis Center, Palm Beach County Convention Center, Wellington Mall, Palm Beach Outlet Stores and Clematis Street.
4. The area's Dennis P. Koehler Preserve, an eight-acre flood mitigation project, was the first in Palm Beach County to be designated as an "Urban Oasis" by Audubon of Florida. Additionally, the Preserve is a significant environmental project since it was designed to provide additional protection of the Lake Worth Lagoon, one of Florida's most valuable ecological resources. The Lagoon historically contains more than 4,000 acres of sea grasses and habitat for numerous species, including over 195 different fish species.
5. The Westgate/Belvedere Homes community also has Palm Beach County's first mobile greenmarket, the Westgate Greenmarket Express. The Westgate Greenmarket Express provides fresh fruit and vegetables to the community on a weekly basis in a "green" retrofitted "Global Electric Motorcar," named "Curbie."
